Discussion starters...

1. How would you respond to someone who honestly believes that the Crucifixion is 'Divine child abuse', or an example of outdated thinking of a God who requires human sacrifice?

2. Mark 10:45-

*... the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve,
and to give his life as a ransom for many."*

How do you understand Jesus as our Ransom? How has he 'redeemed' your life?

3. What we call "Holy Communion" was, for the first disciples, a radical departure from a comfortable and well loved tradition. It likely retained its passion for them. How do you see Communion? What do you feel?

4. Keller (in this chapter and in chapter 12) says "All real, life-changing love is costly, substitutionary sacrifice. And ultimate love demands the ultimate sacrifice." Discuss this profound statement.
