**LITANY OF REMEMBERING**

We have come here today, remembering loved ones who are not here.

We come in spite of our many reasons for wanting not to come.

**We remember our lives, the way they were before our loss.**

**How we yearn for those moments when all was well,  
when we looked forward to the future together...**

There will always be an empty place in our hearts. Help us believe that our sorrow will lessen as the days, months, and years go by. Help us to accept ourselves as being full of need. Help us to accept and celebrate the gifts of love, peace, and joy.

**O God, in whom we long to trust, there is a part of us that has died and a part of us that is coming back to life. We want to have open hands toward you and toward our lives, but it is such a struggle to do so. Remind us often of the peace which you offer us. Renew us day by day. Encourage us, so that we may be faithful to your call deep within our hearts and open ourselves to the mystery of life and to your love.**

Teach us to be patient with the transformation of our lives, and to be open to the changes which we are going through. It is all right for us to let go of our pain, our emptiness and resentment.

**We light a candle to remind us that the memories of our loved ones remain alive. In our darkest hour, it is often the smallest spark that brings us the gift of light and love and hope.**

#### **CANDLE LIGHTING CEREMONY**

**The love we have given, and the love we have received. The love that has gone unacknowledged and unfelt, and the love that has been shared in times of joy and sorrow.**
